**ORDER FOR SURRENDER
OF LICENSE AND CONSENT
TO THE SAME**

7 Daniel Alzheimer, M.D. ("Respondent"), elects to permanently waive any right to a
8 hearing and appeal with respect to this Order for Surrender of License; admits the
9 jurisdiction of the Arizona Medical Board ("Board") as well as the facts stated herein; and
10 consents to the entry of this Order by the Board.

11 **FINDINGS OF FACT**

12 1. The Board is the duly constituted authority for the regulation and control of
13 the practice of allopathic medicine in the State of Arizona.

14 2. Respondent is the holder of license number 59957 for the practice of
15 allopathic medicine in the State of Arizona.

16 3. The Board initiated case number MD-22-0381A after receiving a notification
17 that Respondent's license in Colorado had been suspended by the Colorado Medical
18 Board ("Colorado Board").

19 4. On April 11, 2022, the Colorado Board issued an Order of Suspension
20 Pursuant to Section 12-240-125(8(a), C.R.S. in Case No. 2021-8009-A against
21 Respondent's Colorado medical license ("Colorado Order"). According to the findings in
22 the Colorado Order, an Inquiry Panel of the Colorado Board reviewed a report from a
23 facility where Respondent held privileges that the facility suspected Respondent may be
24 suffering from a mental or physical condition that may affect his ability to safely practice
25 medicine. Based on the report, the Panel requested that Respondent present for an
evaluation with the Colorado Physician Health Program ("CPHP"). Respondent failed to

1 present for the evaluation in the time frame ordered by the Panel. Based on Respondent's
2 failure to respond in a timely manner, the Colorado Board suspended Respondent's
3 license pursuant to the applicable Colorado statute.

4 5. Respondent failed to maintain current residence address, and practice
5 address information with the Board.

6 6. Respondent states that he does not wish to maintain his Arizona license and
7 requests surrender.

8 CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

9 1. The Board possesses jurisdiction over the subject matter hereof and over
10 Respondent.

11 2. The conduct and circumstances described above constitute unprofessional
12 conduct pursuant to A.R.S. § 32-1401(27)(p) ("Having action taken against a doctor of
13 medicine by another licensing or regulatory jurisdiction due to that doctor's mental or
14 physical inability to engage safely in the practice of medicine or the doctor's medical
15 incompetence or for unprofessional conduct as defined by that jurisdiction and that
16 corresponds directly or indirectly to an act of unprofessional conduct prescribed by this
17 paragraph. The action taken may include refusing, denying, revoking or suspending a
18 license by that jurisdiction or a surrendering of a license to that jurisdiction, otherwise
19 limiting, restricting or monitoring a licensee by that jurisdiction or placing a licensee on
20 probation by that jurisdiction.").

21 3. The conduct and circumstances described above constitute unprofessional
22 conduct pursuant to A.R.S. § 32-1401(27)(t) ("Violating or attempting to violate, directly or
23 indirectly, or assisting in or abetting the violation of or conspiring to violate any provision of
24 this chapter."). Specifically, Respondent's conduct violated A.R.S. § 32-1435(A) ("Each
25 active licensee shall promptly and in writing inform the board of the licensee's current

1 residence address, office address and telephone number and of each change in residence
2 address, office address or telephone number that may later occur.”).

3 4. The Board possesses statutory authority to enter into a consent agreement
4 with a physician and accept the surrender of an active license from a physician who
5 admits to having committed an act of unprofessional conduct. A.R.S. § 32-1451(T)(2).

6 **ORDER**

7 IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT Respondent immediately surrender License
8 Number 59957, issued to Licensee, M.D., for the practice of allopathic medicine in the
9 State of Arizona, and return his certificate of licensure to the Board.

16 **CONSENT TO ENTRY OF ORDER**

17 1. Respondent has read and understands this Consent Agreement and the
18 stipulated Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order (“Order”). Respondent
19 acknowledges he has the right to consult with legal counsel regarding this matter.

20 2. Respondent acknowledges and agrees that this Order is entered into freely
21 and voluntarily and that no promise was made or coercion used to induce such entry.

22 3. By consenting to this Order, Respondent voluntarily relinquishes any rights
23 to a hearing or judicial review in state or federal court on the matters alleged, or to
24 challenge this Order in its entirety as issued by the Board, and waives any other cause of
25 action related thereto or arising from said Order.

1 4. The Order is not effective until approved by the Board and signed by its
2 Executive Director.

3 5. All admissions made by Respondent in this Order are solely for final
4 disposition of this matter and any subsequent related administrative proceedings or civil
5 litigation involving the Board and Respondent. Therefore, said admissions by Respondent
6 are not intended or made for any other use, such as in the context of another state or
7 federal government regulatory agency proceeding, civil or criminal court proceeding, in the
8 State of Arizona or any other state or federal court.


9 6. Notwithstanding any language in this Order, this Order does not preclude in
10 any way any other State agency or officer or political subdivision of this state from
11 instituting proceedings, investigating claims, or taking legal action as may be appropriate
12 now or in the future relating to this matter or other matters concerning Respondent,
13 including but not limited to, violations of Arizona's Consumer Fraud Act. Respondent
14 acknowledges that, other than with respect to the Board, this Order makes no
15 representations, implied or otherwise, about the views or intended actions of any other
16 state agency or officer or political subdivisions of the State relating to this matter or other
17 matters concerning Respondent.

18 7. Upon signing this agreement and returning this document (or a copy thereof)
19 to the Board's Executive Director, Respondent may not revoke the consent to the entry of
20 the Order. Respondent may not make any modifications to the document. Any
21 modifications to this original document are ineffective and void unless mutually approved
22 by the parties.

23 8. This Order is a public record that will be publicly disseminated as a formal
24 disciplinary action of the Board and will be reported to the National Practitioner's Data
25 Bank and on the Board's web site as a disciplinary action.

1 9. If the Board does not adopt this Order, Respondent will not assert as a
2 defense that the Board's consideration of the Order constitutes bias, prejudice,
3 prejudgment or other similar defense.

4 10. ***Respondent has read and understands the terms of this agreement.***
