**CONSENT AGREEMENT**

Susan L. Braun, M.D. ("Physician"), elects to permanently waive any right to a hearing and appeal with respect to this Order for Practice Limitation; admits the jurisdiction of the Arizona Medical Board ("Board"); and consents to the entry of this Order by the Board.

**FINDINGS OF FACT**

1. The Board is the duly constituted authority for the regulation and control of the practice of allopathic medicine in the State of Arizona.
2. Physician is the holder of License No. 19984 for the practice of allopathic medicine in the State of Arizona.
3. Physician has recognized that she has a medical condition that may limit her ability to safely engage in the practice of medicine.
4. There has been no finding of unprofessional conduct against Physician.

**CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

1. The Board possesses jurisdiction over the subject matter hereof and over Physician.

**ORDER**

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:

1. Physician's practice is limited in that she shall not practice medicine in the

1 State of Arizona and is prohibited from prescribing any form of treatment including  
2 prescription medications until Physician applies to the Board and receives permission to  
3 do so. The Board may require, at the Physician's expense, any combination of staff  
4 approved assessments, evaluations, treatments, examinations or interviews it finds  
5 necessary to assist in determining whether Physician is able to safely resume such  
6 practice.

7 2. The Board retains jurisdiction and may initiate a separate disciplinary action  
8 based on the facts and circumstances that form the basis for this practice limitation or any  
9 violation of this Consent Agreement.

17 **CONSENT TO ENTRY OF ORDER**

18 1. Physician has read and understands this Order for Practice Limitation and  
19 Consent to the Same and the stipulated Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order  
20 ("Order"). Physician acknowledges she has the right to consult with legal counsel  
21 regarding this matter.

22 2. Physician acknowledges and agrees that this Order is entered into freely and  
23 voluntarily and that no promise was made or coercion used to induce such entry.

24 3. By consenting to this Order, Physician voluntarily relinquishes any rights to a  
25 hearing or judicial review in state or federal court on the matters alleged, or to challenge

1 this Order in its entirety as issued, and waives any other cause of action related thereto or  
2 arising from said Order.

3 4. The Order is not effective until approved and signed by the Executive  
4 Director.

5 5. All admissions made by Physician are solely for final disposition of this  
6 matter and any subsequent related administrative proceedings or civil litigation involving  
7 the Board and Physician. Therefore, said admissions by Physician are not intended or  
8 made for any other use, such as in the context of another state or federal government  
9 regulatory agency proceeding, civil or criminal court proceeding, in the State of Arizona or  
10 any other state or federal court.

11 6. Upon signing this agreement, and returning this document (or a copy  
12 thereof) to the Board's Executive Director, Physician may not revoke the consent to the  
13 entry of the Order. Physician may not make any modifications to the document. Any  
14 modifications to this original document are ineffective and void unless mutually approved  
15 by the parties.

16 7. This Order is a public record that will be publicly disseminated as a formal  
17 **non-disciplinary** action of the Board.

18 8. If any part of the Order is later declared void or otherwise unenforceable, the  
19 remainder of the Order in its entirety shall remain in force and effect.

20 9. Any violation of this Order constitutes unprofessional conduct and may result  
21 in disciplinary action. A.R.S. § § 32-1401(27)(s) ("[v]iolating a formal order, probation,  
22 consent agreement or stipulation issued or entered into by the board or its executive  
23 director under this chapter.") and 32-1451.
